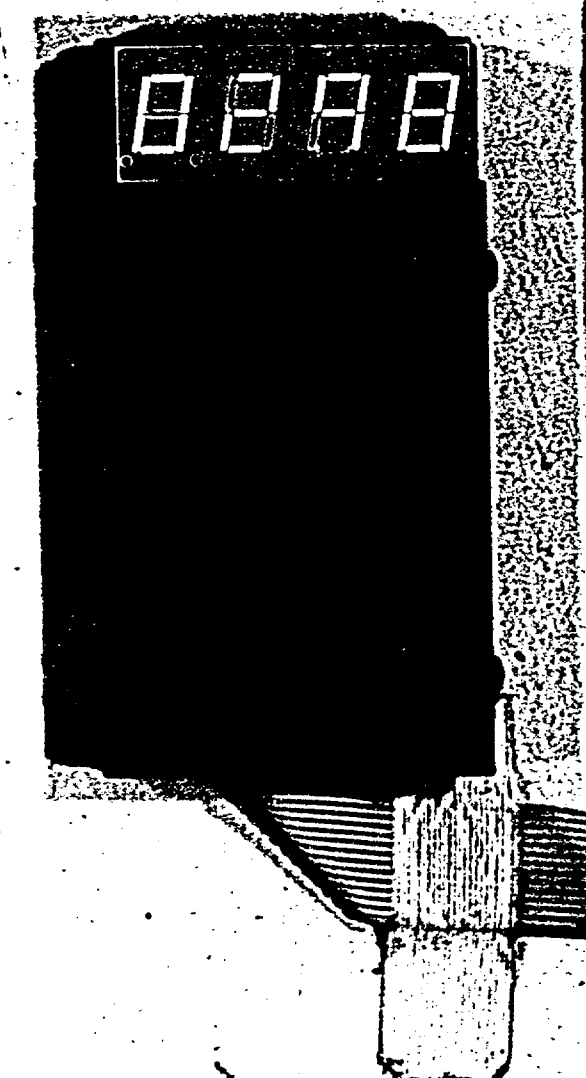
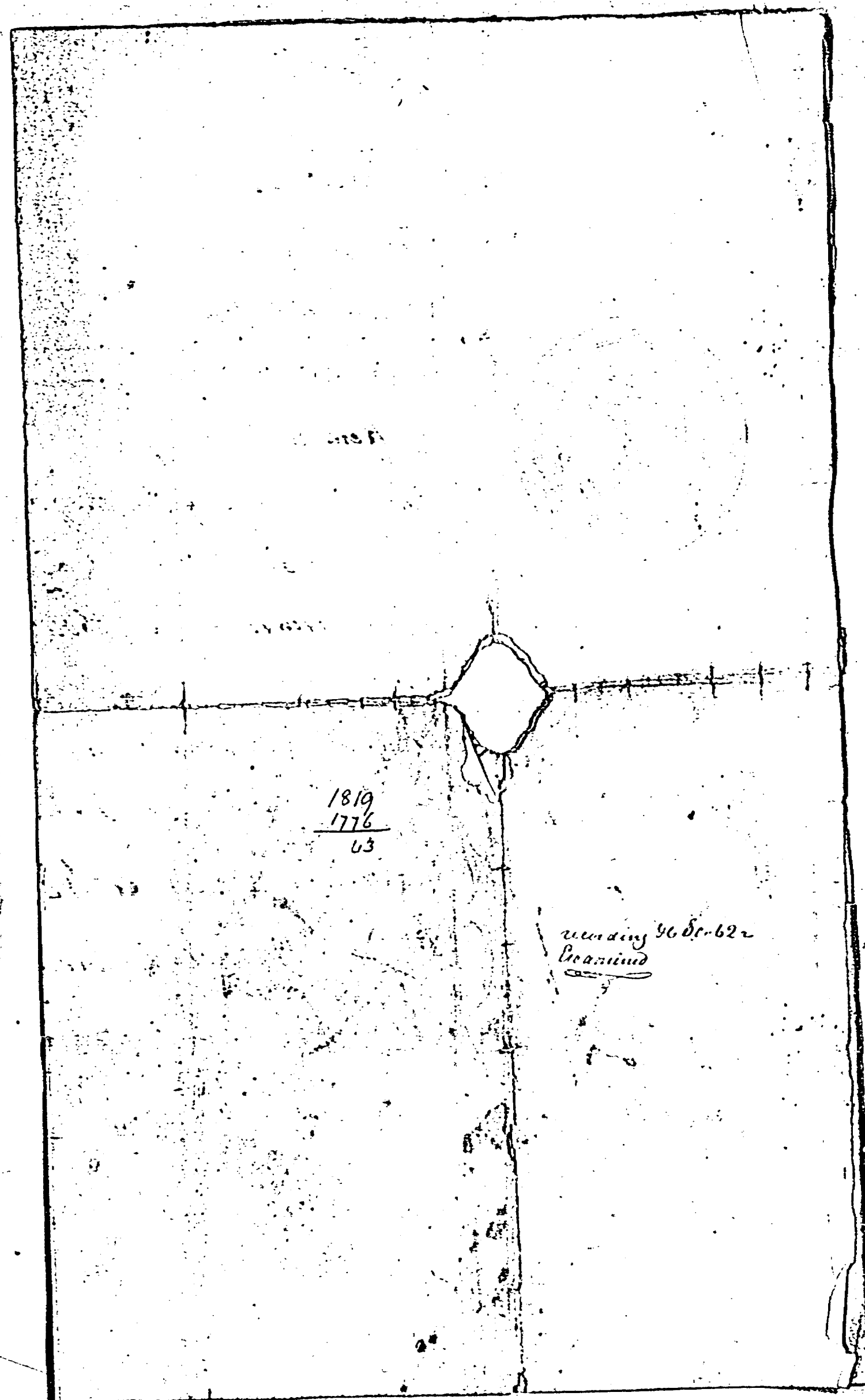

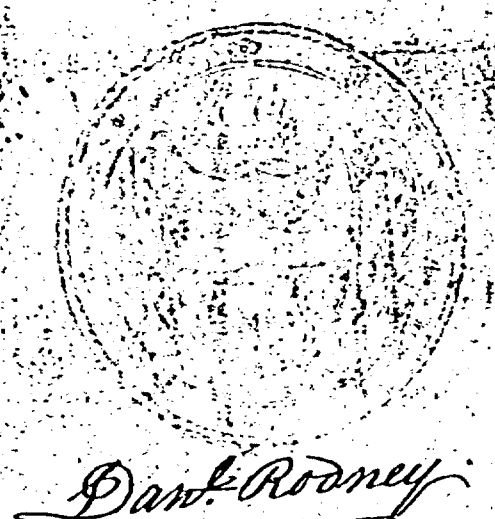

arising until your Term therein shall according to our Constitution of course expire: You behaving yourself well in the said office.

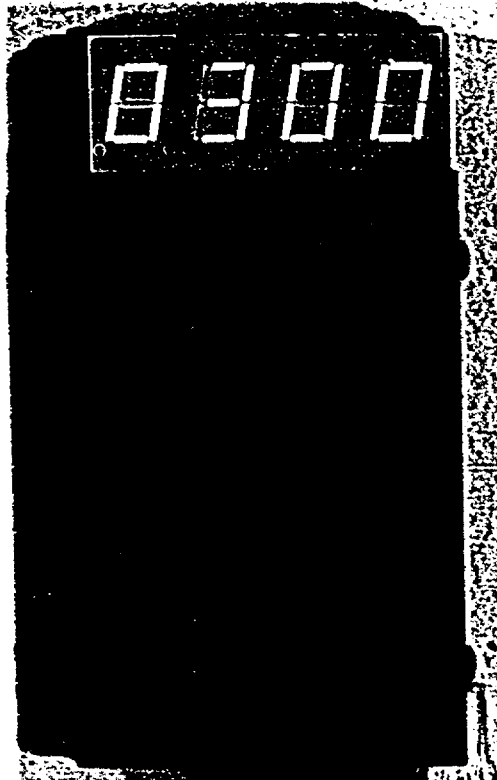

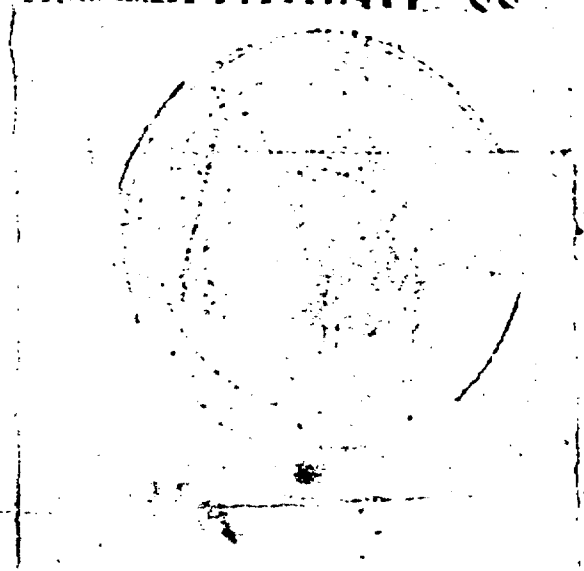
