I am extremely sorry that I was from home when you were in this place. Since my return I have received yours of the 11<sup>th</sup> and intend about to your wishes. I have only time now to inform you that I have at length received the duplicate from Mr. Reynolds. I shall lay the Tax according to law on Monday next and have promised to deliver the duplicate to him by appointment on Monday evening. It has been the usual course to give them to the Clerk of the Peace as the agent of the State Treasurer. I shall at the same time inform him that a warrant is attached to the duplicate authorizing the execution of the State Tax, it must be at his peril that he delivers the duplicate to the collector until they have signed the bond for the collection of the said Tax. I wish you was here to represent this business. I think the collector might be compelled to collect the State Tax. I have made

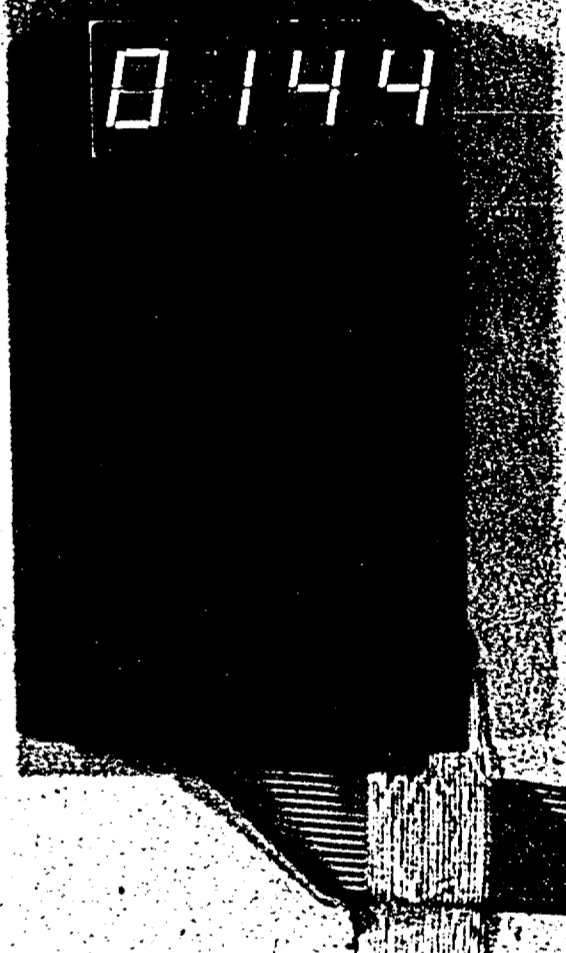

My dear Sir  
I received yours of the 15<sup>th</sup> informing me that  
my Duplicate was ready - and since I will now  
inform you that I have already received it  
with the warrants annexed for the Collection of  
the state Tax but since the Duplicate was done  
in such a manner that it was not fit to act  
upon until I got it corrected owing to the carelessness  
and neglect of Mr Reynolds it contained  
hundreds and fifty six errors besides a number of  
omissions although he has detained it more  
than three months longer than the usual time  
as to respects my collecting the state Tax I must  
inform you that it has been recommended to the  
Collectors of the different Towns of this County  
by a Committee appointed by a large County Meeting  
for that and other purposes - not to give bond for the  
Collection of the state Tax as it was considered that  
there was too great a proportion got imposed on  
this County and it appears that the Collectors has  
unanimously agreed to it; and although it will  
be more to the advantage to me not to collect it  
than any collector in the County I am also  
under the necessity of refusing to collect it  
until there is a repeal of the present Law or some  
other regulations made with respect to the imposi-  
tionment of the state Tax -
