the 1st Vol. of the laws page 577 the Governor procured nine hundred
stands of arms with equipment to furnish them and under the
act of Congress of the 23rd April 1808 five hundred stands of arms with
equipment to be delivered in this State by the Government of the United
States - making in the whole 1400 stands of arms ^{with equipment} to be delivered
By an act of Assembly of the 1st Dec. 1813 (4th Vol. 67) the Governor was
directed to cause one third part of the arms & equipment aforesaid
to be deposited at Dover, which was done as aforesaid under
the care of the Brigadier General of the second Brigade &c. Since
my appointment of Brigadier General I have not had the honor to
receive from you any statement of the number of arms ^{and equipment} aforesaid which
was in your possession or under your care, nor
indeed any papers relating to the proceedings of the Brigadier General
of the second Brigade while that appointment was held by you -
As I am now about to make to the Legislature a return of the ^{public} arms
and accoutrements in this country so far as they have come
to my knowledge, I shall be obliged if you will inform me what
number of arms and equipment aforesaid were in your care
and to whom they were delivered, and what number of them were
delivered by your order: The obligation will be discharged by ^{any} ~~you~~ ^{them}

The Petition of Thomas Pettigrew, respectfully
represents; that at a Court of General Quarter Sessions of
the peace held at Dover in and for Kent County
on the 2^d day of December 1810, he was indicted in
five cases, for selling spirituous liquors by the small
quantity, to all of which indictments, your petition
acknowledges himself guilty, and the Court inflicted
on him the fines incurred by the laws of the State.

Your petitioners begs leave to offer to your Excel-
lency the following reasons in extenuation of his said
offenses, to wit: 1st that he has an infirm and crippled
wife, and two small children, who depend on his
labour for support, and that he is poor and in

knowingly violate the laws of the State again.

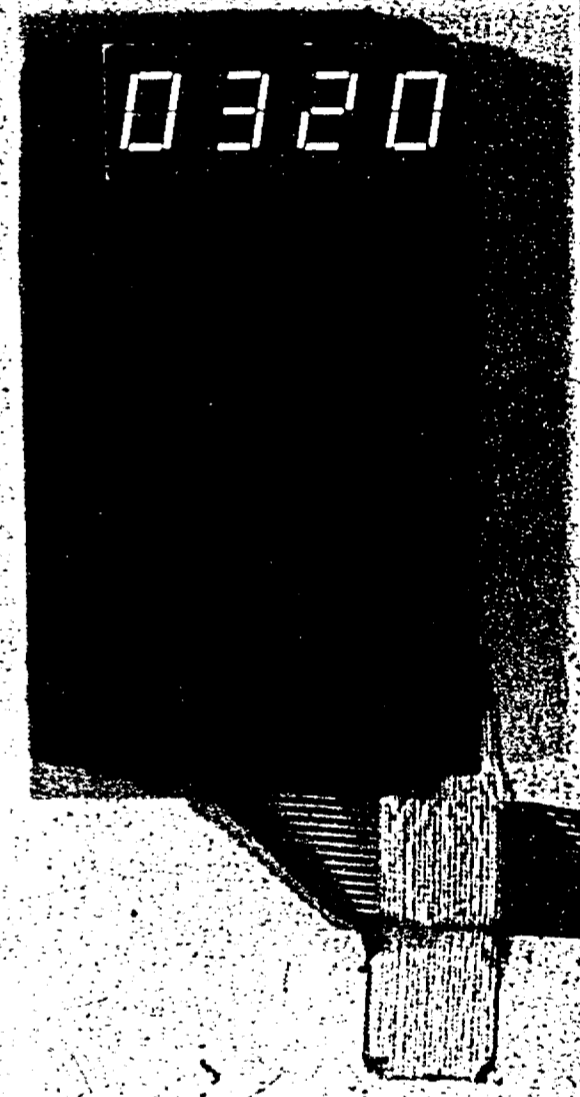

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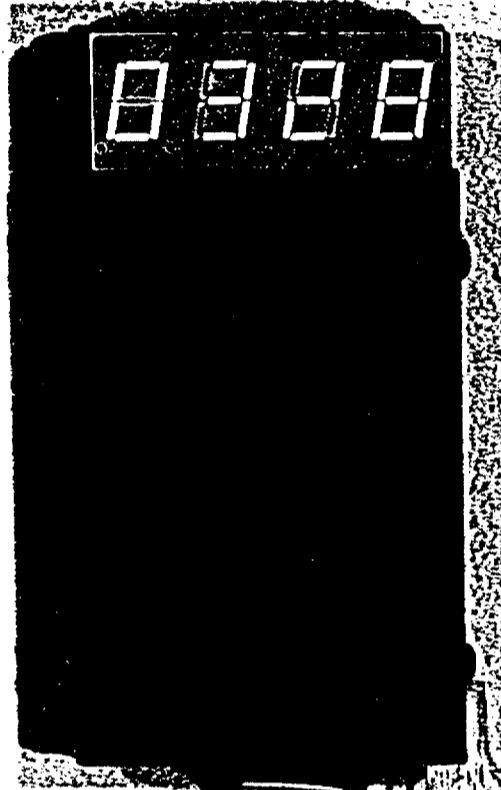

Dear Sir,
New Britain, July 1. 1816.
Altho' I have not written to you earlier, I have
not been unmindful of the business, to which you requested my
attention; but I am afraid I cannot afford you ^{entire} satisfaction
on the subject. I have no knowledge of the Art of Heraldry,
nor have I talents for drawing, and am therefore unable to
give you a drawing of the Arms of the State. The only
description I can give you is - that they consist of a Sheaf
of Wheat, an Ear of Indian Corn, and an Ox in full stature,
within the Shield, with a River dividing the Sheaf of Wheat
and Ear of Corn, which are in the upper part of the Shield,
from the Ox, which is in the lower or under part of the
Shield, below the River. The Supporters are an American
Soldier under Arms, on the right; and a Hudsonian with
a Hoe in his hand, on the left - and a Ship for the Crest.

These are the Devices on the former Great Seal,
which I have always understood to be the Arms of the State.
A description of that Seal you will find in the printed
Journal of the House of Representatives of the 27th of January,
1777.

1777. I have enclosed you two impressions of it, upon instruments
that remained in my possession, which will illustrate the
description, and may be useful, perhaps altogether sufficient
for the engraver's and know of no motto to the Arms, or whether
any has ever been used, and am very much inclined by the opinion
that none has been a defect. But would it not be necessary
to add one? Should not Liberty and Independance be one
that would be proper, appropriate, and unobjectionable?

About the middle of last month, I went during a
interval of the adjournment of the Court to Philadelphia, and applying
to a painter for a drawing of one of the impressions enclosed, stating
to him the purpose for which it was wanted. He did not
understand his duty, and declined it, as he was unacquainted
with the proper colours for the several parts, according to the
rules of that art; but supposed that the impressions would
be amply sufficient for the Engraver, and thought a drawing
not necessary for the purpose stated to him. If you can
cut off the impression from either of the enclosed instruments,
