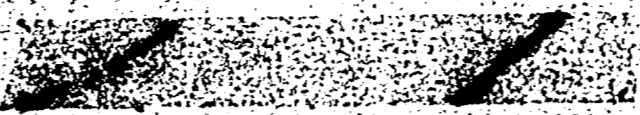
I must request of you to transmit to the Treasurer of your County by the 1st of October next a certificate of all the Taxes inflicted by you from the 1st of September last to the 1st of September next. — It is possible you may have already made returns of some of the Taxes inflicted within the above specified time to the Treasurer, but as they may not have been delivered to me and as I wish to have a view of them all in one statement or in one return, I wish you to make out a new certificate of them. — In making out the certificate I wish you to be particular in stating the name of the Constables to whom you have committed the Taxes for collection, as it is my intention to open an account against each of them for the amount of the Taxes given into their hands to be collected. —

At the same time that you make the return to the Treasurer I wish you to certify me thereof by a letter in which I wish you likewise to give me an account of the amount of the Taxes therein stated by what means, I shall be enabled to know, if I do not receive the returns to whom I should look for them, and if I do whether or not I get the whole that were made, I remain, yours —

Since my return, have applied to the different Post-offices in the neighbourhood, and to my astonishment, have not heard one word of your letter, in answer to mine on the subject of the Taxes for the present year.

I have taken up claims against the State, and for school Fund stock, since I had the pleasure of seeing you, amounting to nearly \$4,000 and many more against the State are pressing for payment. — I hope when the Taxes are paid in, I shall be able to settle and pay all those claims.

Will you be so obliging as to write me again on the subject first above, as I have not yet had materials to make charges against Collectors for the present year.
