The Executive Authority of the State of Delaware; to all persons to whom these presents shall come, greeting:
Know ye that I John Black, Governor of the said State of Delaware, and in whom, by the constitution
of the said State, the supreme executive power thereof is fully vested, have made ordained constituted
and appointed, and by these presents do make ordain constitute and appoint, Henry M. Godwin of
Carver in New Castle in the State aforesaid, the Agent of the Executive Authority of the said State of
Delaware to receive from the Executive Authority of the State of Maryland a certain John Porter
who stands charged, by two several bills of indictment found at a Court of General Sessions
of the Peace and Good Delivery of the State of Delaware aforesaid begun and held at Dover in and for
the County aforesaid on the fifth day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and
seventeen; of the crime of kidnapping and of the crime of burglary, and who, it is represented to me, has fled
into the State of Maryland: hereby granting to the said Henry M. Godwin full power and authority
to receive from the Executive Authority of the said State of Maryland the said John Porter a fugitive
from justice as aforesaid, and him to secure and safely bring into the State of Delaware aforesaid and
lodge in the goal of the County aforesaid, so that he be brought to answer the charges preferred against
him as aforesaid: And I do hereby command all Sheriffs, constables, and yeomen and all other the
good citizens of the State of Delaware aforesaid, and request all other persons, to be aiding and assist-
ing the said Henry M. Godwin in securing and bringing into the said State of Delaware and lodging
in the goal of the County aforesaid the said John Porter, so that he may be brought to answer the charges

STATE OF NORTH-CAROLINA,

The Committee to whom was referred a resolution of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the United States,

REPORT:

That the said resolution is in principle the same with that adopted by the General Assembly of North-Carolina at their last sessions, with a modification of one of the provisions in the said resolution; which meets the unanimous concurrence of your committee. They therefore recommend that the resolution of the commonwealth of Massachusetts, proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the United States, in the words following to wit: "That for the purpose of choosing Representatives in the Congress of the United States, each state shall by its Legislature be divided into a number of districts equal to the number of Representatives to which each state may be entitled. The districts shall be formed of contiguous territory and contain as nearly as may be an equal number of inhabitants, entitled by the Constitution to be represented. In each district the qualified voters shall elect one Representative and no more."

"That for the purpose of appointing Electors of President and Vice-President of the United States, each state shall by its Legislature be divided into a number of districts equal to the number of Electors to which such state may be entitled. The districts shall be composed of contiguous territory and contain as nearly as may be an equal number of inhabitants entitled by the Constitution to representation. In each district the persons qualified to vote for representatives, shall appoint one elector and no more. The electors when convened shall have power, in case any of them appointed as above prescribed shall fail to attend for the purposes of their said appointment on the day prescribed for giving their votes for President and Vice-President of the United States, to appoint another or others to act in the place of him or them so failing to attend. Neither the districts for choosing representatives nor those for appointing electors shall be altered in any state until a census and apportionment of representatives under it subsequent to the division of the state into districts shall be made. The division of states into districts hereby provided for, shall take place immediately after this amendment shall be adopted and ratified as a part of the Constitution of the United States; and successively immediately afterwards whenever a census and apportionment of representatives under it shall be made. The division of each state into districts for the purposes both of choosing representatives and of appointing electors, shall be altered agreeable to the provisions

of this amendment and on no other occasion"—be adopted. And that our Senators in the Congress of the United States be instructed, and our Representatives be requested to endeavour to obtain the said amendment to the Constitution of the United States.

Resolved further, That His Excellency the Governor of this state be, and he is hereby requested to forward a copy of the preceding resolution to each of our Senators and Representatives in the Congress of the United States; and also to the Executives of the several states, accompanied with a request that the same may be laid before their respective Legislatures for their consideration and adoption. 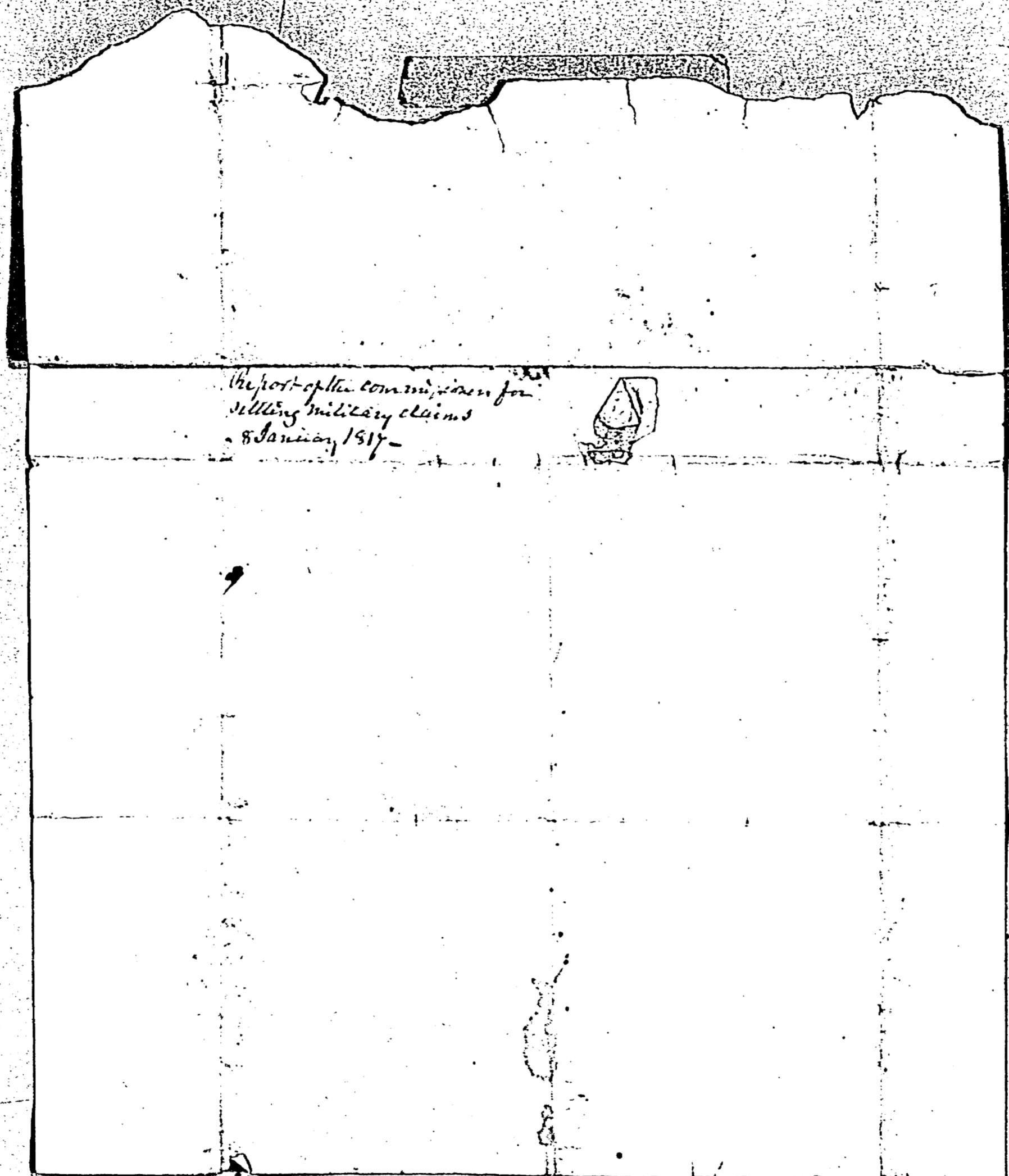
