FOREWORD TO VOLS. IV AND V.

The Public Archives Commission of Delaware herewith submits volumes four and five of the Military Series of Delaware Archives.

These volumes contain lists, substantially full and complete, of the officers and men who represented this State in the second war with England, commonly called the War of 1812, which memorable contest sealed a peace between the United States and the Mother Country which has lasted for over one hundred years.

In addition to the Muster and Pay rolls, many letters, documents and state papers pertinent and interesting have been included in the publication. When the work of collecting and compiling these records was begun the State Archives contained no Muster or Pay rolls. A number of these papers were found in the War Department at Washington, but the greater number in private possession. The Commission believes that in the arduous work of collecting and publishing these records it has rendered important service to the State. Through the generosity of Mr. Septimus E. Nivin, of Landenberg, Pa., the E. I. duPont de Nemours Co. and others, who had these records in their possession, the State now owns the original papers that attest Delaware's great service in this war.

Foot notes indicate the source of the papers not in the Archives of the State. All papers marked "duPont Hall of Records" are now in the possession of the State.

EXPLANATORY.

It was found advisable to publish Volumes IV and V, Delaware Archives Military Series, in advance of Volume III. The latter is now in course of preparation, and will contain supplementary Revolutionary matter.

BRIGADE ORDERS.

Wilmington August 8th 1797.

Sir.

I am directed by the Commander in chief to request General would urge the Brigade Majors; to have the Militia returns compleated and forwarded to me, as Speedy as possible, Agreeably to the forms furnished the begaining of June last. That part of the duty is indispensively necessary and should not be delayed—the quota of militia of this State being 1,168 including officers, are put in requisition by the Executive of the United States and requested to hold themselves in readiness to march at a moments warning, agreeably to the directions of the Act of Congress made for that purpose.

By the 2d. Section of said Act, the Executive of this State, is authorised, to accept any Independent corps of Cavalry, Artillery or Infantry, as a part of the detachment &c provided they voluntarily engage as corps in the Service.

EXTRACT FROM GOV. DANIEL ROGER'S MESSAGE TO ASSEMBLY.

Gentlemen of the Senate and

Gentlemen of the House of Representatives.

Although it is with sincere Regret that I communicate to you the ultimate Failure of the Executive of the United States, in attempting to effect a Reconciliation with the Republic of France, yet it is with no small satisfaction that I reflect on the wise and manly and moderate measures which have been adopted by our Government to attain that object. And should the Injustice and Rashness of our Enemies hurry them to avowed and direct Hostilities, every American must rejoice to find that all the honourable means have been employed by the President of the United States, which the Occasion required, to avert the Calamities of War. In such an Event, it will be a Source of great self gratulation to know, that neither wisdom, Moderation, or Justice has been wanting in our Endeavours to obviate the consequences of the Rapaciousness and mad Ambition of the French Republic. Indeed, were we not assured of the Integrity of our Government, yet the Examples which France has hitherto given of her contempt of the Rights of other Independent Nations, would leave little Room to doubt of her Violence and insidious Conduct, in her contest with us. In no Instance, perhaps, have the Rulers of that Nation discovered less Sincerety, than in attempting to impose on the world a Belief, that She was disposed to make an amicable Adjustment of her Differences with this Country. At the Moment of rejecting the Embassy of the United States was She preparing to display her false Declarations of Moderation and Love of Peace; and though She would not deign officially to receive Proposals of Accommodation, yet did She perfidiously publish to the World her pretended anxiety to restore a good Understanding between the two Nations.

To complete our System of self defence, and more perfectly to co-operate with the United States in resisting the Aggressions of our Enemies, it will be necessary to direct your attention to a revision of the Militia Laws of the State. They certainly are extremely defective in their Provisions; particularly in compelling the proper Officers to make the Returns which are contemplated by those Laws. There are other Cases of Neglect of Duty, in which adequate Remedies are not provided. It is essentially necessary that our Militia should be placed on the most respectable Footing, in order that we may be prepared, at all Times, to resist hostile attacks from every Foe. In cases of sudden Invasion, or on other unexpected Emergencies, where the Security of the People may require an armed Force, an efficient Militia will afford the most prompt Means of Defence.

In compliance with the Authority given to Me by the Act of the General Assembly entitled "An Act to provide for the arming "the Quota of the Militia of this State, required by an Act of Congress of the United States" I made an effort to procure the arms required by that Act, but I found that such, as are there directed to be purchased, could not be had. This Scarcity of Arms of that Discription I do not apprehend will be permanent, and I have reason to believe that in the course of the ensuing year, they may be easily obtained. The Sum of Money allowed by the said

Act would not have been sufficient, even if the Muskets could have been procured. I was happy in making temporary arrangements, for the Supply of the Militia of this State with Arms, if any Occasion had required them; so that the State would not have been unprovided, although the Act could not literally be complied with.
