Petition of J. Lachem

To the Honourable the Senate and house of Representatives of the state of Delaware in general Assembly met.—

The petition of Thomas Latchum respectfully represents that your petitioner as Captain of the first company of the fifth regiment of the militia of this state expended for mervice, drum heads, drumsticks and fife, for the use of said company, the sum of nine dollars and twenty five cents, for the payment of which he received an order from the Col. and first Major of said Regiment on the Comisary of military stores ~~of said~~ and owing to circumstances not within the control of your petitioner said order was not presented to the said Comisary in time to be allowed by him before he paid over all the money in his hands to the state Treasurer in consequence of which your petitioner is not likely to receive the money so as aforesaid expended without legislative aid— your petitioner therefore prays your honourable body to enter into such regulations as shall be thought proper to authorize the state Treasurer to pay over the aforesaid sum of money to your petitioner or his order as shall seem best to your honours— And your petitioner &c.
