

Wilmington Del. January 18th 1902.

A meeting called by J. G. Longfellow for the organization of a Society of the War of 1812 in the State of Delaware, was held at the Delaware Historical Society's rooms this date at 8 o'clock P. M.

J. G. Longfellow was appointed chairman, F. H. Megaw, Secretary. On motion of Bishop Coleman, it was decided to call this organization, the Society of the War of 1812, in the State of Delaware, subject to the provisions of the constitution and by-laws of the General Society.

On motion of F. H. Megaw, seconded by N. H. Hutchins, the chairman appointed the following as a nominating committee:

Bishop Coleman moved that the Constitution and By-Laws of the Society of the War of 1812 in the state of Maryland be used. Motion carried.

Bishop Coleman moved that the secretary be instructed to extend vote of thanks to the Historical Society for the use of the room.

No further business coming before the meeting, adjourned.
