& Specification

Charge 1st. Unsoldier like Conduct.

Specification 1st. In that the said John Fowler while on Drill on the
morning of the 16th Inst. behaved in a disorderly manner.

To which charge & Specification the prisoner pleads not guilty.

Sergeant Fealing being duly sworn says that on the morning of the 16th that he
observed that the company performed the Manual exercise worse than ever he
had seen them. John Fowler made answer. he would not try to do any better.

John Alexander being sworn says that he heard the prisoner say he could
not do his exercise any better. The Court after mature deliberation find the
prisoner not guilty. and order him to return to his duty. The Court then
proceeded to the Trial of Jacob Byrick a private in Lieut-Taylor's Comp^y.
